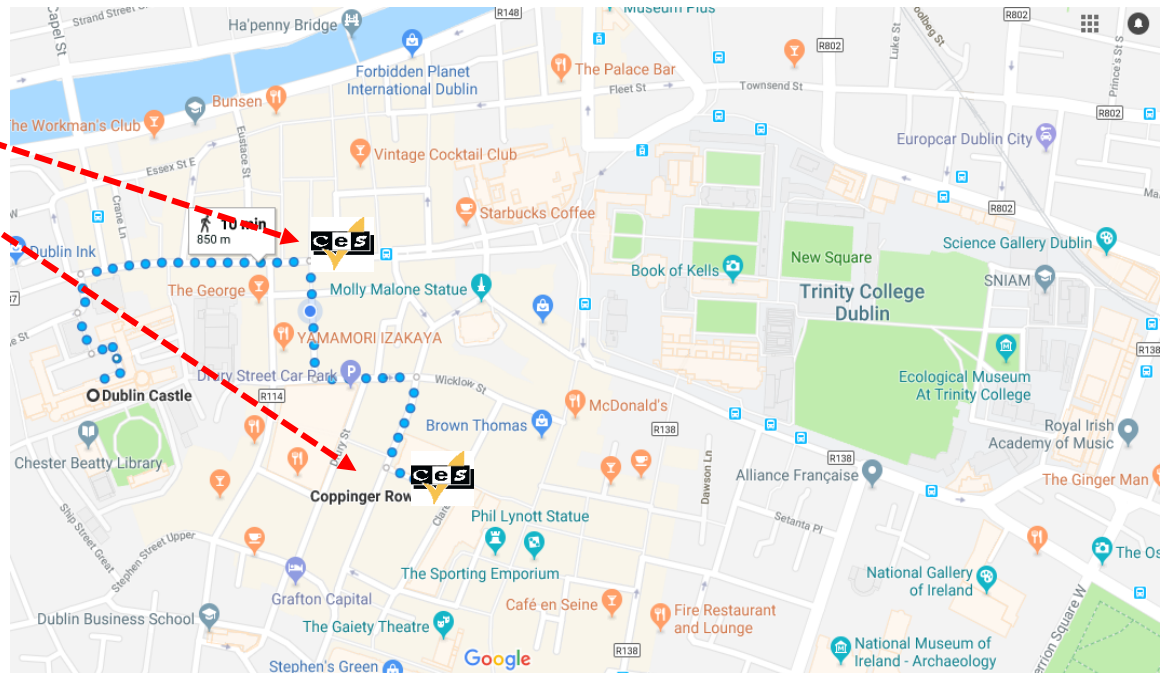

## Suggested activities for free time!

There is a wide variety of places to visit and activities to try during your free time in Dublin. Why not visit Dublin's main shopping district, on Henry Street on the North side of the city; here, you will find Dublin city's two main shopping centres: Jervis and Ilac, and also the largest Penneys! (That's what Primark is called in Ireland)

Three of Ireland's main cultural exhibitions are free to enter and located within minutes of each other: **the National Gallery of Ireland**, **the Natural History Museum of Ireland** and **the National Archaeology museum of Ireland** are right next door to each-other! Also located nearby to these buildings are the Irish government buildings and also Merrion Square: a beautiful park which may be a suitable picnic location on a fine day and is home to the childhood home of famous Irish writer, Oscar Wilde.

Other museums and galleries in Dublin include **the Hugh Lane gallery**, which you will be visiting. Located next to it is the Dublin Writers' Museum at the top of O'Connell Street. Another important gallery which you could visit is **the Irish Museum of Modern Art** which is located near the famous Kilmainham Gaol an easy walk from Heuston train and LUAS station, and **Collins Barracks Museum**, located directly on the LUAS line.

**Epic Ireland** is a new attraction in Ireland and one we highly recommend. It is a museum focused on emigration and Ireland's impact on the world, and it features interactive and technology-based attractions more than ancient artefacts, making it a very refreshing and different cultural experience. At €13 per person, it is well worth a visit.
